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Anthonij Rupert Wines

Anthonij Rupert Wyne was founded on the farm, L'Ormarins in Franschhoek. Originally owned by the late Anthonij Rupert, who passed away in 2001, the farm was eventually taken over by his brother Johann Rupert in 2003 and the brand named after him. It was Johann Rupert who constructed a state-of-the-art winemaking facility, catapulting the farm into a prestigious wine estate and the beginnings of what is now a sprawling enterprise.

Arra Vineyards

Situated in the heart of South Africa's Cape Winelands, Arra Vineyards enjoys an ideal location where we grow, produce, and bottle all our wines. The Klapmuts Mountain provides us with an abundance of water and shelters us from the Cape's south-easterly winds, while providing our vines with ideal soils and north facing slopes for ample sunshine.

Ataraxia

Ataraxia was founded in 2004. Husband and wife team, Kevin and Hanli, in partnership with a few friends, purchased 50 hectares of prime vineyard land. The landscape in which Ataraxia is situated, called The Skyfields is unique, lying as it does on the most elevated section of the Hemel-en-Aarde area.

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Beaumont Family Wines

Beaumont is a family owned and managed farm situated in the heart of the town of Bot River ("Botter Rivier") in the Overberg. The farm, home to the region's oldest wine cellar, was originally established in the 1700's by the Dutch East India Company. In the 1940's the wine business was initially started but wine production was discontinued in the late 1960's

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

Boland Cellar

Nominated as one of South Africa's top 20 export companies in their category, being named one of the top 100 wine producers in the world by the World Association of Wine & Spirits Writers as well as being arguably the top wine producer from the much acclaimed Paarl region, gives us much to be grateful for

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Cederberg

Six generations ago, no one would have guessed that this rugged, fynbos-covered area on the edge of the Succulent Karoo biome would one day become the Cape winelands' highest-altitude wine farm.

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Clos Malverne

Seymour Pritchard bought the 10-hectare farm, Malvern Heights, in 1969 from Colonel JW Billingham, who had named the farm after the rolling hills around Malvern in his native England. When winemaking came into Seymour's sights in the mid-1980's, France was still the epicentre of the wine universe. He then added some "French Flair" to the name and

Constantia Glen

Constantia Glen has a unique position cradled between the Constantiaberg and Table Mountain (World Heritage Site) ranges, with predominantly north-east facing slopes. This singular location allows for exposure to late afternoon sun, ideal for the slow ripening that shapes our classically expressed wines.

Constantia Uitsig

Constantia's history dates back to 1685, when Simon van der Stel named his property after the daughter of the benefactor who granted him a farm nestled beneath a picturesque mountain range. The lush setting and moderate temperatures bode well for farming and van der Stel set to work planting orchards and vineyards.

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De Grendel

Sir David Graaff first planted vines on De Grendel in 1999, almost 200 years after the last vines were destroyed. Since then De Grendel has become synonymous with exquisite wines, borne of the Graaff's love of the soil and scientific approach to winemaking. De Grendel, meaning latch or lock in Dutch, is one of Cape Town's oldest farms, stretching out over almost 330 hectares on the fynbos-covered slopes of Tygerberg Hill.

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De Wetshof Estate

In 2004 De Wetshof became the first known South African wine estate to receive the three most sought after national and international certificates relating to quality management systems, safety and hazard standards.

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Dombeya Wines

The Dombeya tree is native to South Africa, with extraordinarily beautiful flowers that bring South Africa's spring season to life. Dombeya trees are dotted around our vineyards, their cycle of regeneration and renewal a fitting symbol of modern day South Africa. Dombeya is a part of a country that is evolving and changing, each year growing into its new, dynamic, modern identity.

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Doolhof Wine Estate

The valley in which Doolhof lies is blessed with unique and varied terroirs. The microclimates, growing conditions and soil types make it ideal for growing wine grapes. The Estate lies between Bain's Kloof and the Groenberg Mountain Range. The result is soils that are finer, more balanced and deeper than in the surrounding countryside with clay content evenly distributed.

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Eagles Nest

Eagles' Nest is cradled in a secluded valley high up on the slopes of the historic Constantia mountain range, which forms part of the World Heritage Site, Table Mountain.

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Edbaston Wines

Edgebaston wines are made by David Finlayson on the Finlayson family vineyards in Stellenbosch. The range of wines is made to reflect the personality and winemaking philosophy of the region and the Finlayson family.

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Excelsior Wines

The De Wet family have farmed at Excelsior Estate, in the Robertson wine valley, since 1859 when Koos de Wet settled here and began clearing the veld of the Little Karoo.

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Glen Carlou

Started in 1844, Hess Family Wine Estates is a family-owned, fourth-generation company with a deep commitment to responsible agricultural and business practices. Founded in Bern, Switzerland, Hess Family Wine Estates seeks, develops and mentors businesses worldwide that reflect the company's values of tradition, quality and sustainability

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Goede Hoop Wine Estate

Goede Hoop Wine Estate is situated off the old road between the towns of Stellenbosch and Kuils River, deep in the valley known as the Bottelary Kloof. The old farmhouse, rich in atmosphere, was built in 1880. In 1928 the Bestbier family purchased the wine estate and today Pieter Bestbier is a third generation winemaker on Goede Hoop.

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Groenland

The Steenkamp family are the third generation owners of Groenland and have established a reputation for producing outstanding red and white wines in the fertile Bottelary area near Stellenbosch. Complex varietal wines such as Cabernet Sauvignon, Shiraz and a special blend, Antoinette Marie, have placed the estate in the forefront of superior red wine production. Maturation takes place in American and French oak barrels.

Haskell Vineyards

Haskell Vineyards makes its home on the slopes of the Helderberg mountain range in Stellenbosch. The Helderberg, also known as the 'Golden Triangle', is widely recognised as South Africa's finest wine growing sub region, and is the residence of many of the most famous names in South African wine.

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Krone

The historic Twee Jonge Gezellen farm in Tulbagh is the home of Krone, a collection of notable, vintage-only South African Méthode Cap Classiques made from grapes grown and night-harvested in this distinctive terroir. Open to the public for tastings and tours, our farm is currently being restored to reflect its impressive heritage and contemporary renaissance.

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L'Avenir

L'Avenir L'Avenir Estate, situated in an area of the Stellenbosch winelands known as the 'golden triangle', is a proud producer of award-winning Pinotage wines. Enjoy wine tasting at the cellar door or for guests who wish to stay, the Estate also offers accommodation at the 4 star L'Avenir Lodge.

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Le Riche Wines

Le Riche Wines is situated on the slopes of the Helderberg Mountain, in close proximity to the historic town of Stellenbosch. The winery was designed to replicate our previous winery in Jonkershoek, which was built in 1911. With old style open top concrete fermentation tanks mixed with a modern minimum intervention wine making approach, the winery provides a platform to create ultra premium red wines in a classic South African style.

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Louis 57 Wines

Louis has found the perfect accompaniment to his achievements at the Boschklouf Private Cellar near Stellenbosch. The product of owner and veteran winemaker Jacques Borman, the boutique 25 hectares of prime winemaking estate yields some of the best quality grapes, and therefore wine, in the region and in South Africa. This personal involvement with the soil and hands-on approach to viticulture produce timeless wines such as the Conclusion, The Open Championship Syrah and the Louis 57 Chardonnay, amongst others - make up the Louis 57 Private Collection.

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Middelvlei

The estate covers 160 ha of which 130 are planted with Pinotage, Shiraz, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Sauvignon Blanc and Chardonnay. The Pinotage vines are grown as bush vines, severely pruned in winter, while the rest of the varieties are trellised to keep the grapes cool. Under the Momberg's watchful eye the mature vineyards are kept in prime condition, while new plantings are carefully chosen to suit the terroir. The body and backbone contributed by the mature vines are complemented by fresh fruitiness derived from more recent plantings.


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Oak Valley

Oak Valley Estate was founded in 1898 by Sir Antonie Viljoen, a medical doctor who graduated from Edinburgh University in Scotland. Sir Antonie was also a Senator in the Cape Parliament and was knighted in 1916 for his efforts to bring together Boer and Brit in the bitter aftermath of the Boer War.

Central to the success of the wine and farming business is the Cluver Family – a close-knit group with a visionary, pioneering spirit. Four of the five Cluver siblings are currently involved in the business, taking over the reins from parents Paul and Songvei. Paul Cluver IV is managing director, Liesl is marketing director, Inge is financial manager, Karin is production manager (orchards). Winemaker, Andries Burger, is married to Inge.

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Raka Wines

The Raka brand was named after Piet Dreyer's black fishing vessel. Piet's first love has always been the sea. For some 36 years he braved the storms and challenges of the coast, ever in search of the best catch. It is with this same passion that the Dreyer family now pursue the art of winemaking. With the rich blessing of earth and elements, the help of a dedicated workforce, the enthusiasm of winemaker Josef Dreyer and the advantages of a modern gravity flow cellar, Piet Dreyer produces his award-winning Raka wines.

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Ridgeback

The Rhodesian Ridgeback dog originates from Southern Africa, where legends and stories abound of their exploits and bravery in the African bushveld. Their tenacity and ruggedness are symbolic of the pioneering spirit of Africa. The pedigree, character and stature of this impressive animal are reflected in our full bodied red wine which will continue to mature, if carefully cellared, for up to 10 years.

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Saronsberg

Despite the modern nature of our facilities and our progressive approach to winemaking, Saronsberg is an inextricable part of the deep history of the Tulbagh valley. The valley is flanked on all sides by mountains in the Upper Breede River Valley and is unique in its topography and natural beauty. During the night of 29 September 1969 most of the picturesque little town and surrounding area was partly destroyed by the most destructive earthquake in South African history.

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Simonsig

The name Simonsig. means “to see or have a view of the Simonsberg mountain”. Simonsig, one of South Africa’s most reputable wine estates, upholds a legendary status in pioneering wine excellence shaped by the Malan dynasty’s devotion to quality and innovative winemaking. Simonsig is a private family owned winery near Stellenbosch, owned by the Malan family.

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Stellenbosch Vineyards

We are one of the largest branded product exporters in South Africa, exporting 85% of our products. The company formed in 2004 with the amalgamation of Stellenbosch Vineyards and Vinfruco and traded as the company of wine people until 2012, when the name changed to Stellenbosch Vineyards. Our head office is on Welmoed Estate, the oldest proclaimed farm in the Stellenbosch district with a history stretching back to 1690. We aim to react quickly to a forever evolving market and to be a one-stop South African wine solution to our partners.


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Strandveld

Tamboerskloof

The de Villiers family has left deep footprints in the history of the South African wine industry through the centuries, and Kleinood and the Tamboerskloof wines are no exception. The French Huguenot, Jacob de Villiers, bought the wine farm Boschendal between Stellenbosch and Franschhoek, after immigrating to the Cape of Good Hope in 1688. In the year 2000 Gerard de Villiers, a direct descendant of Jacob, and his wife, Libby, found the piece of land that stole their hearts – complete with mountains, river and a pristine tract of indigenous forest.

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Teubes

Grandfather Sybrand Teubes is still farming side to side with his son, Johan Teubes, and his grandson Sybrand Teubes on the farm where the cellar is located, Houmoed. The Teubes family has been making quality wines close to the Atlantic ocean in the Western Cape of South Africa for half a century. The cool afternoon breezes, an abundance of sunshine and perfect terroir contribute to this premium quality wine.
